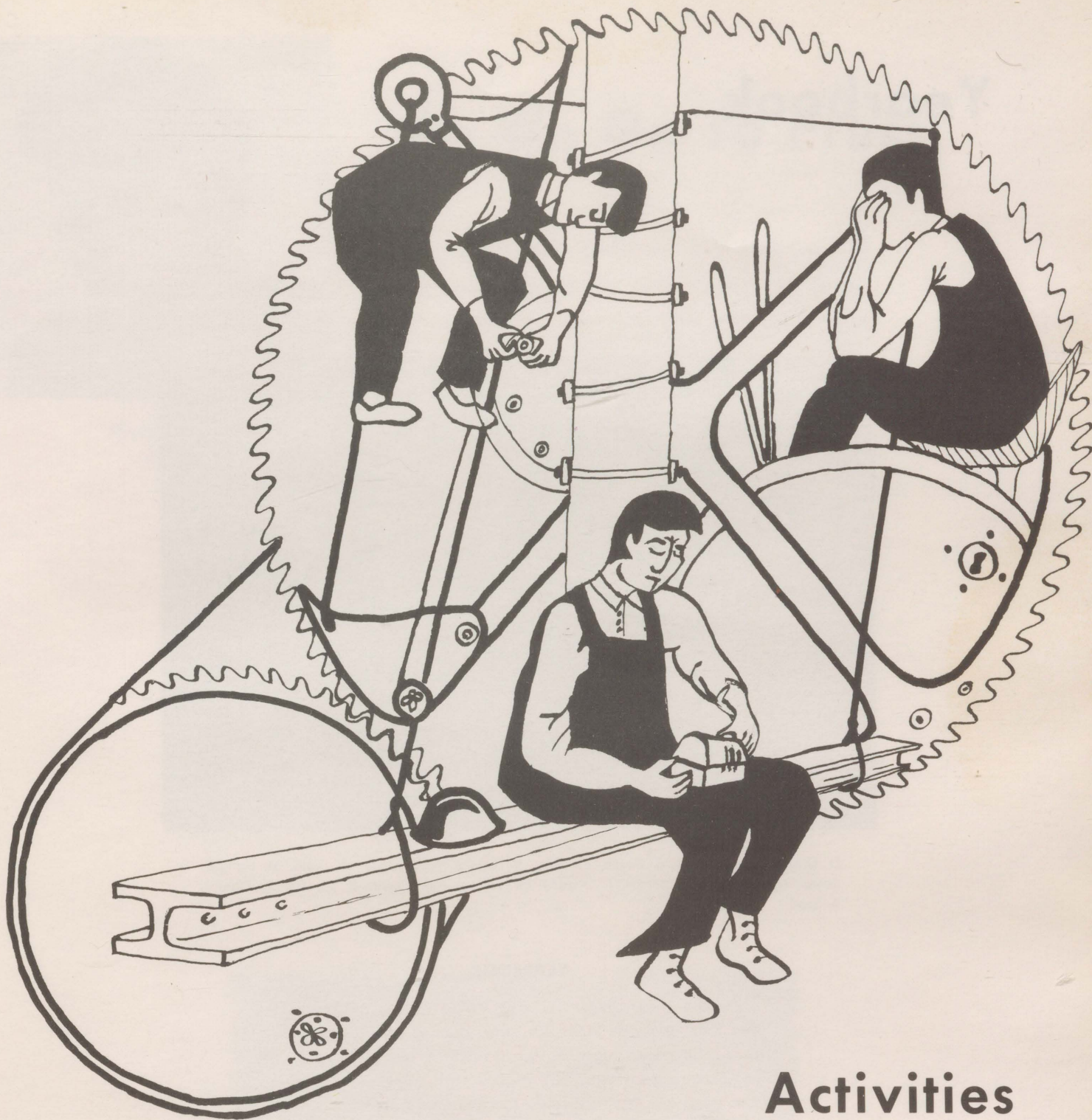
"WORDS AND SONGS"

It was a night for both schools to remember and a very enjoyable one indeed.



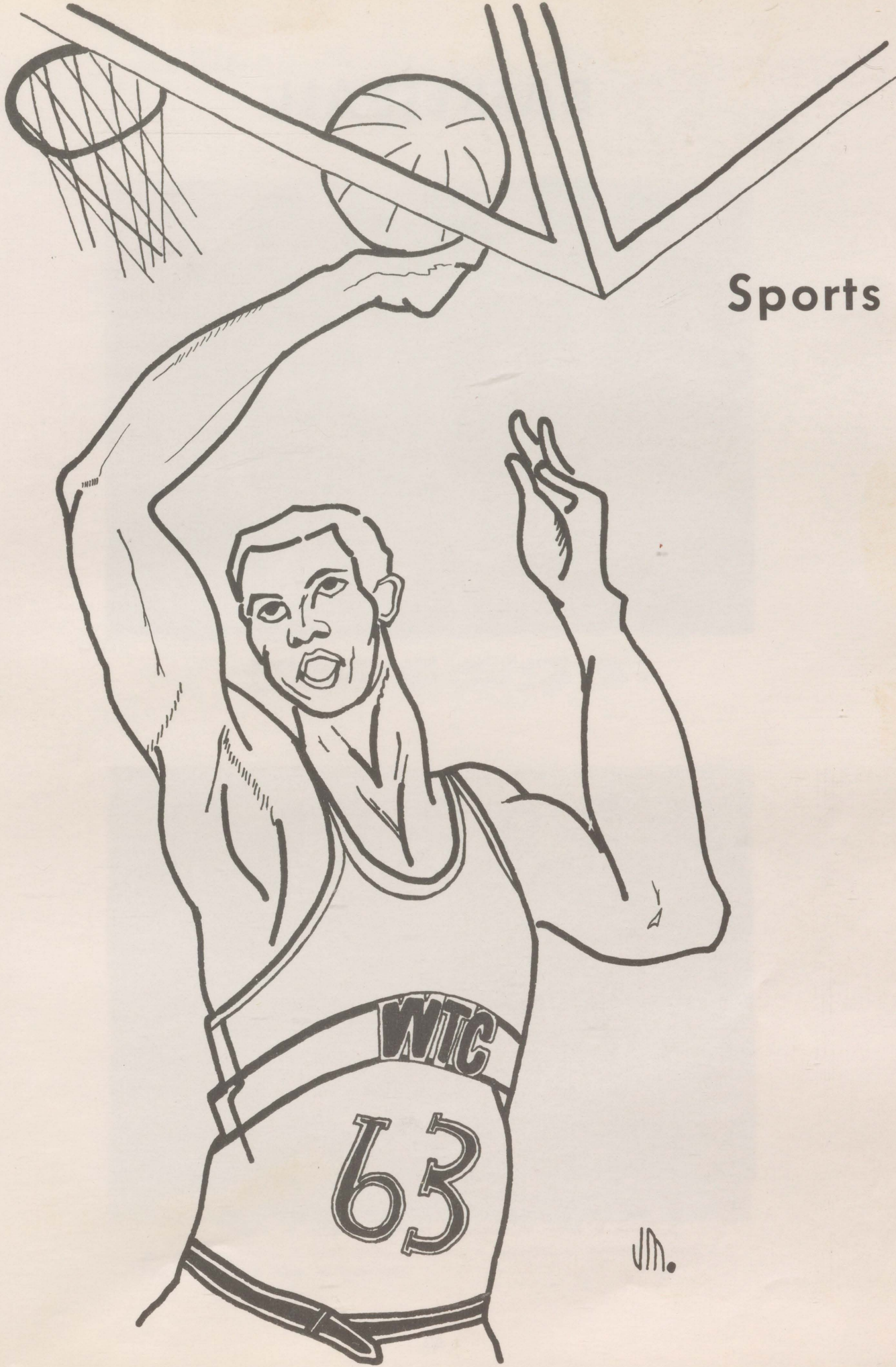
