A meeting is scheduled for Tuesday evening, Feb. 10, be-tween Sandwich West Conneil and representatives of construc-tion firms now in the midst of building homes in the area.

Purpose of the meeting is for council to hear what is antici-pated by these builders in the line of new homes for 1953, how many are planued, how they will be financed and what is to be lone to provide local improve nents. Also to be discussed ar plans for new school,, additional clasrooms to schools, and the new water main scheduled for township.

During the month of January During the month of January 97 permits were issued by the township's building inspector, George Hooker, for new dwell-ings. For the most part, the homes are being erected on a large project scale by three large Windsor firms — Economy Home Builders, Bersch Con-struction and Morris Construc-tion, and in all cases, local ser-tice innorvennents, such as vice improvements, such as water mains, roads and sewers will be installed and financed

will be installed and imanced by the builders. It is anticipated that close to 500 new homes will be built during the year, which will in-crease 1952's total by more than 500

The meeting will be held in the township hall at 8 p.m.


