#### Hydro's Mobile Work Centre Moving to Harrow Sept. 21

Ontario Hydro's 60-cycle Ontario Hydro's 00-cycle changeover program will commence in the Harrow district on September 21, 1953, and on that day a mobile work centre will be set up in the municipality.

Announcing this today, Onta-Amounting this today, Onta-rio Hybro Chairman Robert H. Saunders stated that these cen-tres have been brought into use to provide speedy and economi-cal changeover service as the standardization program in Es-sex County moves farther away from Hydro's main area "F" base in Windsor.

The mobile work centres com-

Two warehouse vans contain-ing conversion materials, motors

A machine shop van where mo-tor base aaptions etc., are made; An office trailer, which main-tains radio contact with the Windsor base and vehicles work-ing on changeover in the dist-rict;

rict;
A workshop trailer in which
conversions are made on clocks,
pedestal fans, etc., and on phonographs requiring bench work;
A motor shop trailer; here minor motor repairs and conversions needing bench work are
made.

made: A trailer which handles the paper work involved in connection with completed changeovers; A diesel generator, which sup-plies the necessary 60cycle pow-er, up to 550 volts, for the work

A 100-foot portable platform, complete with flood lighting system.

Replacement parts for appliances are despatched from Hydro's main warehouse at Islington, near Foronto, and reach work centres the day before changeover. These materials are boxed separately for each individual customer, and at changeover time merely have to be loaded into the truck of the technician, who is to effect the convresion.

Urgenly needed material is obtained from Hydro's area base in Windsor by means of radio-equipped rumer vehicles. Direct drive washing machines, which are more economically changed over in a specially equipped worshop, are picked up by trucks from customers' homes and taken to the work centre. From there they are transported to the Windsor base, where the motors and gars are changed. notors and gears are changed,

Work centres can be disman-Work centres can be disman-tied, moved and set up in appro-imately six hours. If work on dismantling starts at 9 a.m., the work centre can be moved and established in a new location some miles distant, and be ready for operation by 4 p.m.

"By establishing these work centres closer to the 'cutover' areas, the time required by the workmen to travel to the homes and other premises concerned is greatly reduced," Chairman

The work centre to be set up in Harrow was previously in use in Amherstburg.


