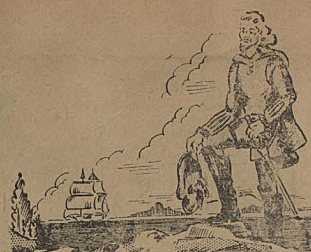

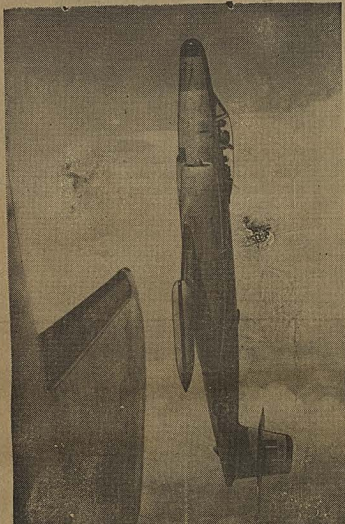

LA SALLE COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the LaSalle Council was held on Monday evening, October 19th. Mayor Herbert Runstetter was absent due to illness and Reeve Albert Nutkins was also absent.

Mr. Ted Seaward, assistant town clerk, was elected to attend a meeting at Kingsville for the Essex County Assessors.

Council approved the sale of the town tractor to Mr. Ernest Gignac for the price of \$200. Mr. Gerry Craig, representing the LaSalle Chamber of Commerce, advised the council that the chamber had purchased ten street signs which would be erected by the Chamber. The council suggested that the following streets on Front Road be the first ten signs erected: Reaume, Bouffard, Superior, Huron, LaFleur, Gladstone, Maple, Kensington, Boisjart and Westminister.

By-law No. 364 was passed closing up about 100 feet of 2 43-ft-wide road running parallel to the waters edge near Turkey Creek, Lot No. 30, plan No. 1048.

Council appointed three members of the court of revision which will sit November 3rd to hear assessment appeals. The members are Sheridan Atkinson, Sam Chappus and Gordon Reaume. Five appeals against property assessments have been received and 31 for changes in school support.

Permission was given to Mr. Alex Butosi for the purchase of four desired lots subject to the approval of the municipal board.

Mr. Don Morand, solicitor, was instructed to return the papers to Dr. A. Jung regarding the Bezaire property.

Two applications and the application of Mr. William Pajot for the purchase of 33 acres of land near the golf course are receiving immediate attention.

The matter of a Polio Committee will be discussed at the next meeting.

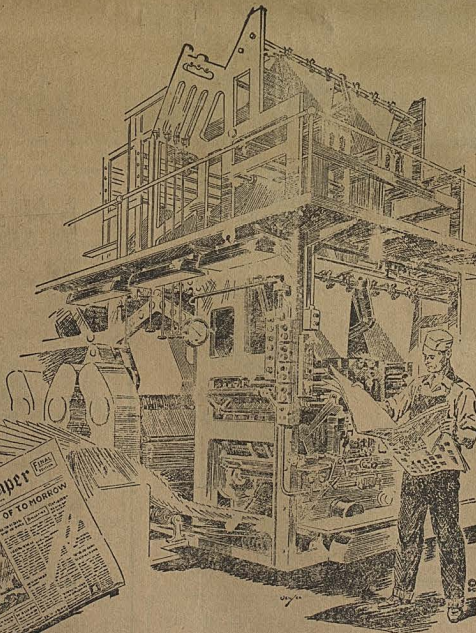

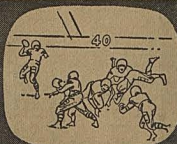

Sandwich West Bus Service on 2-Week Trial

On Friday evening, October 16th, the Sandwich West Council held a special meeting with Mike Matalik, operator of the bus line, in order to restore the bus service to Windsor from Sandwich West on Dougall Rd.

Mr. Matalik cut off this service on Saturday, October 10th, as he was losing money. At this special meeting he showed the council how he was losing from \$10 to \$26 a week.

An agreement was reached whereby two buses will be run in the morning and two in the afternoon on two weeks trial. From Monday, October 19th, buses will leave No. 3 Highway terminal in Sandwich West at 7.15 and 8.15 a.m. for Windsor, and leave the Windsor terminal for Sandwich West at 4 and 5.15 p.m. On Saturday, the buses will leave Sandwich West at 8.30 a.m. and 10 a.m. and return at 9.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m.

Mr. Matalik is to report to the council at the end of the first week on his financial situation regarding the Dougall Rd. bus service.
