


speed. The idea worked out so well that use of flashing blue lights was finally restricted in this province to snow removal and winter maintenance equipment only. This was done by Ontario Regulations 140-55, dated July 31, 1935, under the Highway Traffic Act.

Traffic Act. Now that winter seems to have set in, all drivers of mo-torized vehicles are urged to watch for flashing blue lights, snow plows and sanding trucks especially during storms when are endeavoring to keep main highways clear and free from treacherous giare ice.

Large snow plows are a bit wider than half of a two-lane highway. The dangerous extra width is often hidden by snow heing removed from the road. Sometimes, the vehicles have to move quie slowly, and es-pecially so if the snowfall is

If following a blue-beam ve-hiele in a storm, notorists are in rear of the plow, sanding advised to keep fully 500 feet truck or other meechanism us-ing flashing blue lights as warn-ing signals.
